In medicine, a differential diagnosis is the distinguishing of a particular disease or condition from others that present similar clinical features. Differential diagnostic procedures are used by physicians to diagnose the specific disease in a patient, or, at least, to eliminate any imminently life-threatening conditions. Often, each individual option of a possible disease is called a differential diagnosis. More generally, a differential diagnostic procedure is a systematic diagnostic method u

With the symptoms listed above relating to kidney stones, and the symptoms that Mrs. Smith is presenting with, there is reasonable rationale to rule out kidney stones as a possible differential diagnosis. Provisional and Differential Diagnosis Differences

Differential diagnosis: The process of weighing the probability of one disease versus that of other diseases possibly accounting for a patient's illness. The differential diagnosis of rhinitis (a runny nose) includes allergic rhinitis (hayfever), the abuse of nasal decongestants and, of course, the common cold.

Definition of Differential diagnosis

Differential diagnosis must be established with other pulmonary defects, including CDH and bronchopulmonary sequestration (BPS). PS shows overlapping features or may coexist in 50% to 60% of cases.²⁵ The differential diagnosis of CDH should be straightforward when the homogeneous US appearance of the lung parenchyma is confirmed.
